Care Net Pregnancy Center of Frederick

Dear Salem United Methodist Church:
Happy 2020! It is hard to believe that 2019 has come and gone! On behalf of the board, staff, and volunteers we thank you for your generous giving to the center. The financial seed you have planted here has been used for Kingdom purposes listed below:
197 pregnancy tests, 75 ultrasounds, 30 STI appointments, 85 female clients and 6 male clients attending 11 Earn While You Learn Classes. We had the honor to engage in spiritual discussions with 253 clients, shared the Gospel with 92 clients, and prayed with 111 clients. 34 women came to the center vulnerable to abortion. After receiving services from the center, 26 of these women chose life for their babies. That is 76% that chose life! Please join us in praying that all of these numbers are increased in 2020!
Thank you for your sacrifice of giving. We pray that you are refreshed as you refresh others.

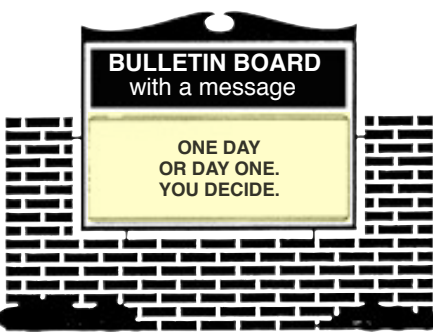

RECIPE



Old-Fashioned Swiss Steak

INGREDIENTS:

2 pounds round steak	1 cup chopped onion
1/2 cup all-purpose flour	1/2 cup chopped green pepper
1/2 teaspoon salt	1/4 cup soy sauce
1/2 teaspoon pepper, divided	1/2 teaspoon garlic salt
2 tablespoons vegetable oil	Hot cooked noodles, optional

DIRECTIONS:

1. Cut steak into serving-size pieces. Combine flour, salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper; sprinkle over steak and pound into both sides.
2. In a skillet over medium heat, brown steak on both sides in oil. Transfer to a greased 13-in. x 9-in. x 2-in. baking dish; top with onion and green pepper. Drizzle with soy sauce; sprinkle with garlic salt and remaining pepper.
3. Cover and bake at 325 degrees for 1-1/2 hours or until meat is tender. Serve over noodles if desired. Yield: 6-8 servings.

Proverbs 10:12 – "Hatred stirs up conflict, but love covers all wrongs."



The January 20, 2020, devotional in Our Daily Bread is titled "Clean Containers."

Do you believe that we have encounters with God?

Our Lord offers us encounters every day. One day, Jesus took three men up on a mountain to encounter God.

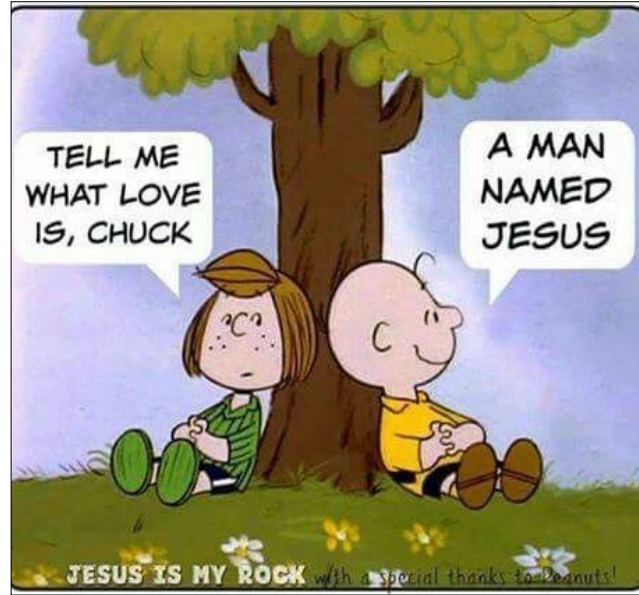
