Message from the Pastor and Worship in April

ike Jesus' birth in December, the celebration of Jesus' resurrection this April is a special holy moment to us as individuals and in the life of the church.

Jesus' resurrection fulfills the purpose of Jesus' birth and allows us to boldly claim, "Because He lives, I can face tomorrow" — no matter what may come our way. Jesus lives and that means so do we!

Salem has a tradition of celebrating Holy Week and Easter with a series of activities: Adult Choir praising God, the Last Supper Drama, our meaningful Good Friday service, the Prayer Vigil, Community Easter Egg Hunt, the Community Easter Sunrise Service at St. John's this year, and our Easter Sunday service followed by children's recitations.

We can never come close to repaying God for all He does for us. But we can give praise and honor to him frequently, and Easter is a time when we strive to do this in a special way.

During April we'll also be offering communion several times. We're excited to be praising and honoring God as a church family. Come and join in the excitement! God Bless. $-Pastor\ Bob$

April 3 Holy Communion "Straining" Philippians 3:4b-14

Philippians 3:13b – "But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining towards what is ahead."

We've heard the expression, "don't live in the past." It's tempting to live in the past and keep recycling the misfortune that has come our way or the bad choices we have made. Even in that muck, we're tempted to stay there because it is familiar to us.

The Apostle Paul testifies that he has chosen not to live in the disappointments of the past but to reach for a better future that



lies ahead; not only reach for it but strain to grasp it. We can choose to do this too. And when we do we find the better future that's out there waiting for us.

April 10 Palm Sunday "Deciding What We Need" Luke 19:28-40

Luke 19:38a – "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord."

As a child we have to learn what we really need. We need to study to learn, practice our instrument to play a song well, and exercise to stay fit.

Without the help of adults teaching us, we'd probably play instead of studying, watch TV instead of practicing, and sit in a chair instead of getting exercise.

We think we know what we need but it takes our loved ones to teach us and guide us.

On Palm Sunday, the crowd thought they needed a conquering king to free them from Roman occupation.

But they came to learn that what they really needed was to believe in Christ as their Savior, receive the gifts of salvation and eternal life He was offering them, and become his followers.

Deciding on the greatest of needs helps put all our other needs in their proper place.

April 17 Easter Day, Holy Communion "Resurrection Day" Luke 24:1-12

Luke 24:5b-6a – "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, he has risen!"

I believe for many, this is one of the most treasured statements in the Bible, "He is not here, he has risen!" Our faith and our future rests on these words conveying that the resurrection of Jesus has happened. What he promised his followers came true.

How surprised, amazed, and filled with joy they must have been when it finally sunk in: Jesus is the Savior! Jesus is the Lord!

Easter is a celebration of Jesus' resurrection. It is also a celebration of our own resurrection promise and the reality that now that Lent has passed and Easter has come, we have been resurrected into new life with Christ on this day.

Our relationship with Christ has been restored, our lives have been renewed, and we are free to live boldly in faith. Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! And so are we!

April 24 "Life in His Name" John 20:19-31

John 20:31 – "But these words are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name."

On Easter Sunday we focused on the words "He has risen." This week we focus on the words, "by believing you may have life in his name." "You may have life" — true life, full life, meaningful life "in His name."

From time to time we ask essential questions. How did this all get here? Who am I? What is life's purpose? What does a life well-lived look like? Where am I going?

God provides answers through the Apostle John: "by believing you may have life in his name."

Through Jesus, God provides the answers to all our essential questions. Praise God!

Ham Supper Casserole

INGREDIENTS:

- 4 cups diced boiled potatoes 1 3/4 cups diced leftover ham
- 1/4 cup chopped pimento 1/3 cup chopped green pepper 3 tablespoons shortening
- 1 cup grated cheese 1/2 teaspoon paprika

1 1/2 cups milk

3 tablespoons flour

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Combine potatoes, ham, pimento, green pepper. Place in casserole.
- 2. Melt shortening; blend in flour and milk and cook until thick, stirring constantly.
- 3. Add cheese, paprika, salt and pepper to taste. Add sauce to mixture in casserole.
- 4. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes.



After being postponed for two years, the Creation Music Festival will be held June 29 through July 2, 2022. Salem folks will be camping at the festival and participating in the full 4 days of Christian music concerts and other activities.

Get Your Tickets Now

Two years ago, Salem purchased 15 tickets for the 2020 festival which was postponed twice due to COVID. Our tickets will still be honored at this year's festival. Our full-event tickets were purchased at the group rate of \$96.85 each, and Salem is offering the tickets to Salem folks at \$50 each, slightly more than half the full price of the 4-day ticket.

After being announced in church, 6 of the 15 tickets have been reserved so far— Camilo, Gary, Valentina & Wanda Barkdoll, Sue Ellen Stottlemyer, and Loralli Snyder.

If you are interested in attending, as of this writing, 9 tickets are still available on a "first-come first-serve" basis. If more tickets need to be purchased, this year's price is substantially higher and will incrementally increase as time gets closer to the event.

The Creation organizers are working hard to line up Christian music groups to perform. As of this writing, the following groups are planning to be at Creation this summer, with more to be announced.




