

Turning "shoe boxes" into Christmas gifts for children

Share the love of Jesus, through the power of a simple gift, with children around the world.

W e will once again be participating in OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD, in which we fill shoe boxes to be distributed to needy children around the world. This is a project of Samaritan's Purse, a Franklin Graham ministry in Boone, North Carolina.

HOW TO PACK YOUR BOX

We are asking anyone wishing to participate in this program to fill their shoe boxes at home and bring them to the church on or before **Sunday**, **November 13th**.

Your shoe boxes should be packed for children ranging in ages from 2-4 years old, 5-9 years old, or 10-14 years old.

Shoe boxes are available in the hallway outside the sanctuary, or you can wrap your own shoe box. Labels are available at church to place in the box, identifying if the items inside are for a boy or girl, and the appropriate age group.

Once we have filled our boxes, we will take them to a local distribution center

Boxes are due by Sunday, November 13, 2022

where they will then be sent to another distribution center in North Carolina, and then will be sent out to the children.

POSTAGE is \$10.00

There is a \$10.00 postage charge for each box. Place the postage amount in the donation envelope and place the envelope on top of the gift items inside the box so it is clearly visible.

Checks should be made payable to Samaritan's Purse, with a note on the memo line that the gift is for Operation Christmas Child. If you are unable to pay the postage, Salem will pick up this cost from our Mission Project No. 2.


Potato Project — Society of St. Andrew

40% of Food Grown... Goes to Waste

You may be shocked to learn that in the past year, 40% of all food grown in the United States went to waste rather than to feed people.

It's a food system problem that boils down to simple addition, as some food becomes waste at every step from farm to fork.

Some food is left behind on farms; some is lost or becomes waste in the transportation process; still more makes it as far as the grocery store or restaurant before it falls prey to loss or spoilage; and a lot goes to waste at the household level, too. Ultimately, about 25% of the food the average American family buys— they'll never eat.

November 6 All Saints Sunday Holy Communion "Great, Good, Grace, Glory" Psalm 145:1-5, 17-21

Psalm 145:4 – "One generation will commend your works to another; they will tell of your mighty acts."

Four attributes of God are lifted in today's scripture reading. The attributes are: Great, Good, Grace, Glory. God is great. He is the maker of all that is, and he rules over all that is. God is good. He loves and cares for all of creation. God demonstrates grace. He is at work in our lives for our good, making himself known to us, saving us from sin and death, and leading us on to become more and more like him. God's glory is seen in God's actions: establishing his kingdom, saving and delivering us, protecting us, and working against evil.

These attributes of God compel us to praise him, believe in him and follow him, and "tell others of his mighty acts."

November 13 "I'm Afraid"

Isaiah 12

Isaiah 12:2a – "Surely God is my salvation; I will trust and not be afraid."

"I am afraid" are three of the most honest words we can say. On the back of today's bulletin, author Tammy Tilley quotes President Franklin D. Roosevelt, "The only thing we have to fear is fear itself." The president, speaking these words during the Great Depression was addressing Americans who needed something to believe in again, something to give them hope. "I am afraid" are the words we spoke during the height of the COVID pandemic.

Our fears are at the root of so many of our struggles. Admitting we are afraid, exploring the cause of our fears, and owning them – these are healthy ways of overcoming our fears and moving forward.

As we strive to overcome our fears, these three words are invaluable: "God, help me."

November 20 Christ the King Sunday "Everyone's King" Jeremiah 23:1-6

Jeremiah 23:5 – "'The days are coming,' declares the Lord, 'when I will raise up to David a righteous Branch, a King who will reign wisely and do what is just and right in the land.'"

Recently, the people of the

Commonwealth of England celebrated the life and 70-year reign of Queen Elizabeth. There were speeches, funeral processions, people filed by her coffin, and there were several funeral services. She was their earthly sovereign and thousands turned out to thank her and pay their respect to her.

As grand as it all was, there is one who is everyone's King— sent by God, born in a stable, no place to call home, crucified on a cross, gave all of himself for us— He is Christ our King. He is King of Kings and Lord of Lords, and we celebrate Him today!

November 23

Community Thanksgiving Service

7 p.m. at Salem

Start your Thanksgiving holiday this year giving thanks to God from whom all our blessings flow throughout the year. It is right that we give God our thanks and praise on this special night.

November 27 First Sunday of Advent "Salvation Is Near!" Romans 13:11-14

Romans 13:11b – "Our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed."

Today is the First Sunday of Advent. Webster's Dictionary defines advent as the "arrival of a notable person, event, or thing." In the Christian-sense, Advent is the season that we remember and celebrate the arrival of God who has come from heaven to live with us on earth. This first Sunday in Advent traditionally focuses, not on the coming of Jesus on Christmas but, on the return of Jesus at the end of time. It is in the resurrection of Jesus and his final return that we understand the true meaning of Christmas.

The four Sundays of Advent leading up to Christmas are an opportunity for us to especially practice watching for Christ in our daily lives, seeing his good works on our behalf, and giving thanks and praise to him. Christ, our Salvation, is ever nearby. Do we see him? Now let us give thanks and praise to him!

¹*Editor's Note:* The reason Pastor Bob indicated this year's Thanksgiving Service at Salem will be "extra-special" for him is because it will be the last time he will host this community service at Salem as Salem's pastor. The mandatory retirement age for ordained ministers in the United Methodist Church is 72. Pastor Bob will be 72 on March 24, 2024, and therefore must retire in 2024.

RECIPE **Pumpkin Pie Squares** INGREDIENTS: 3/4 cup salted butter, softened 1/2 cup raw or white sugar 1 1/3 cups all-purpose flour 3 eggs 3/4 cup brown sugar, packed 1 (15 oz.) can pumpkin 1 tablespoon cinnamon 1 cup oatmeal 1/2 cup pecans, chopped 1/8 teaspoon nutmeg 8 oz. cream cheese, softened 1/8 teaspoon ground ginger DIRECTIONS: 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Mix butter, flour, and brown sugar together. Mixture will be crumbly. Stir in oatmeal and pecans. 2. Reserve 1 cup of crumb topping; press remaining mixture into bottom of a greased 9 x 13 baking pan. Bake for 15 minutes. З. Beat cream cheese and sugar until smooth. Add eggs, pumpkin, and spices; mix until smooth and well blended. Pour over crust, sprinkle with reserved crumbs and additional cinnamon. Bake for 25-30 minutes, or until set. Serves 14-16. 
We will be holding a special practice at 6:30 p.m. on November 23, prior to the Thanksgiving service.


