

Salem Mission Project No. 4

Christ Cream Ministry

In January of this year, Salem added a new mission project called Christ Cream Ministry, led by Tim Leber, well-known coach, teacher and leader of Fellowship of Christian Athletes at Middletown schools before retiring two years ago.

While teaching, Tim often said when he retired he didn't want to just retire from something but rather retire to something.

Tim describes this ministry as very simple— it's just free ice cream and prayers.

Tim takes his van loaded with ice cream to churches, vacation Bible schools, outdoor picnics, school events, summer camps, family reunions, wherever he is invited. Tim has attended several events at Salem and most recently the Wolfsville Community Vacation Bible School.

In early August, the Frederick News-Post published a story about Tim's ministry at the Frederick Rescue Mission. Every Tuesday, Tim goes to the Mission to serve the people waiting in line for free groceries, food or clothing. According to the article, at 11 a.m. Tuesday, July 30, people waiting for the Mission's Food Distribution Center to open at 1:30 p.m. lined across the block. Tim was there, giving the children (and adults) ice cream and offering a prayer for each one. The Mission welcomes Tim's ministry saying it's such a festive thing and gives everyone a little spurt of fun and refreshment.

[So far this year, Salem has provided \$350 to the Christ Cream Ministry.]

A Bit of History

Where did the idea of a Lord's Acre Festival originate?

The Lord's Acre program was developed in the southeastern United States as a means of raising funds in small congregations with limited financial resources.

A "portion" or "acre" of a church member's land was set aside to raise crops, or sometimes farm animals, to be sold to benefit the church.

Those without land could set aside a portion of their needlework, craft items, or any other salable talent they possessed. The Lord's Acre Festival is a sale of those donations.

Salem's Lord's Acre Festival

Salem's Lord's Acre Festival, an annual event which began in 1960, works just that way. Most everything sold is donated by members and friends.

In the festival's early years, one Salem family raised a hog, butchered it, and donated a sugar-cured ham which was sold at auction by the pound.

Salem's first Lord's Acre Festival was held on October 8, 1960, during the pastorate of Rev. John W. Schildt. It was Rev. Schildt who introduced the Lord's Acre "idea" to the Salem congregation and helped to get it started. The profit from that first festival totaled \$742.34.

In the old Wolfsville School: 1960-69

In the 1960's, the festival was held in the old Wolfsville School, located adjacent to the church (where the parsonage and parking lot are now).

All of the activities were held indoors on the lower level of the school building, which was decorated by the Youth Fellowship with harvest-time decorations like corn shocks, colored leaves,

pumpkins and gourds.

Move to Wolfsville Ruritan Park: 1970

During the late 1960's, the condition of the old school house was deteriorating, and in 1970, Salem decided to move the festival to the Wolfsville Ruritan Park. At the park, the festival had room to grow, and that it did.

Much of the food menu has remained the same since the festival's beginning homemade soups, good country cooking. Many people attend the festival to eat the homemade food that has been so consistently delicious for so many years.

God has blessed our efforts and we praise Him for it. Profits go to Salem's Building and Improvement Fund.



Baked Apple Squares

INGREDIENTS:

13/4 cups sugar

3 eggs

2 cups sifted flour

1 teaspoon baking powder

1 teaspoon cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 cup cooking oil

2 cups thinly sliced McIntosh apples

1 cup chopped nuts (optional)

DIRECTIONS:

Beat sugar and eggs until light colored. Add sifted dry ingredients. Add oil and vanilla. Fold in thinly sliced apples and chopped nuts. Bake in greased 9 x 13 inch pan at 350 degrees for 40 minutes. Place pan on rack to cool. Cut in squares. May be frozen.

What the Rapture is all About

will give a \$100 bill to the first person to show me where the word "rapture" appears in the Bible! Don't hurt yourself. There is no verse because the actual word "rapture" does not appear in the Bible. (Fear not, though, because the word "trinity" does not appear in the Bible, either.)

I was meeting with a church member in my office this week (which I LOVE doing), and the conversation came around to the topic of the rapture of the church.

This individual admitted, "I don't really understand the rapture."

Since we are in the sermon series on Revelation, I figured I would use this newsletter article to elaborate on the prophetic event of the rapture, since the rapture is a crucial part of the end times.

While the word "rapture" does not appear in the Bible, it is based on the Latin word rapiere that means to "snatch away." It is the event that will see Christians caught up to meet the Lord in the air to be with Him forever.

We read in I Corinthians 15:51-52, ⁵¹But let me reveal to you a wonderful secret. We will not all die, but we will all be transformed! ⁵²It will happen in a moment, in the blink of an eye, when the last trumpet is blown. For when the trumpet sounds, those who have died will be raised to live forever. And we who are living will also be transformed.

We also read in I Thessalonians 4:15-17, ¹⁵We tell you this directly from the Lord: We who are still living when the Lord returns will not meet him ahead of those who have died.

¹⁶For the Lord himself will come down from heaven with a commanding shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trumpet call of God. First, the Christians who have died will rise from their graves.



¹⁷Then, together with them, we who are still alive and remain on the earth will be caught up in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. Then we will be with the Lord forever.

These two passages are the bedrock of the event known as the rapture.

In other words, when there is a shout from Heaven and the trumpet sounds, Jesus will come in the air.

Those who are believers that have preceded us in death will rise and be joined with their spirits (which were with Jesus the moment they passed).

They will have a new, glorified body for eternity.

Then, those of us on earth who are true believers will be instantly transformed into our glorified, eternal bodies. That is the nature of the rapture.

The question remaining is, "When will it happen?".

The answer is, we do not know. At least, we do not know FOR SURE. Some scholars believe the rapture is the next event to occur and that it can happen any minute.

Following the rapture will come the Tribulation period. Others believe it will take place mid-way through the Tribulation period. (These people are affectionately called "mid-trib" believers). Some teach that the rapture will take place at the end of the tribulation and, still, there are some who think that the rapture will not take place.

As we study the Book of Revelation, it is my desire that you will all have your beliefs confirmed!

Worship for September

Sunday, September 1, 2024 Revelation 3:14-22 The Church at Laodicea: The Carnal Church

Our sermon series on the seven churches of Revelation comes to a close with the church at Laodicea.

This is the only church with NOTHING positive written about it. This is the church that was neither hot nor cold. It was lukewarm and was worthy of being spewed out of Christ's mouth.

This letter is the most scathing letter of the seven and we will see why God dealt so harshly with it. We will learn what God expects from us in our Christian life.

Sunday, September 8, 2024 Revelation 6:1-17 The "Seals of Disapproval"

There are three sets of seven judgments that will take place on earth during the seven-year period known as the Tribulation.

The seals are the first of those judgments, where each seal represents a particular event.

We will examine what the Bible says about those events and gain a better understanding of God's Plan. It is imperative that we have an active response to guard against apathy.

Sunday, September 15, 2024 Revelation 8:1-9:21 The Trumpet Judgments

The seventh seal was thirty minutes of silence in Heaven. Then seven angels were seen, and each angel had a trumpet. Each trumpet was another judgment that will be more severe than the seven seal judgments. Six of the trumpets will be sounded at that time.

God will be getting more intense with His judgments because His purpose is to punish people for rejecting Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

Again, the temptation can be to become mere spectators and look at what will happen. The challenge is to have these verses impact how we live today.

Sunday, September 22, 2024 Revelation 10:1-11:19

The Two Witnesses and the Last Trumpet

God will be looking for people to believe in the Gospel of the Kingdom during the Tribulation Period.

Therefore, He will send two Witnesses to the earth to testify of God's power. We will

learn what they do and what happens to them. We will also observe what happens when the seventh trumpet is blown.

The tension will be mounting as God's judgment is about to be ramped up even higher.

Sunday, September 29, 2024 Revelation 12:1-17 The Tribulation: Act I 'The Woman with the Dragon Tattoo'

The Tribulation Period will involve several characters. In today's text, we will be introduced to the Woman and the Dragon.

We will see who these entities are and what their significance to the world is.

Keep in mind, these will be things that will be part of God's divine timetable, and God's divine plan.

These images will not always make sense, but they are important for us to understand so that we may serve God in a greater way now.

Heroes' Club After School Ministry

It's a Salem Mission Project

Salem's "new" Heroes' Club will begin Monday, September 23, 2024, and will continue to meet each Monday when school is in session.

A Team of Volunteers

Pastor Neil has assembled a team of nearly 20 volunteers to work with this ministry during the fall semester. The volunteers met on August 13th to learn how the ministry will be conducted.

All volunteers are being subjected to background checks to assure a safe sanctuary for the children.

No Cost to the Children

Unlike previous years, Heroes' Club students will not be charged any fees to attend. This ministry will be funded solely as a Salem Mission Project (No. 13). Of course, as with all other Salem mission projects, folks may make donations to missions at Salem Community Church in support of this ministry. Just indicate Heroes' Club on your donation.

Pastor Neil asks that we begin praying for God's blessing on this ministry and for reaching into the homes of the community.

HEROES' CLUB IS RETURNING TO SALEM IN SEPTEMBER

For children Kindergarten through 5th Grade

The Salem Church Council recently designated the "new" Heroes' Club as Salem Mission Project No. 13.

Pastor Neil has been meeting with Principal Veroni at the Wolfsville Elementary School to continue and develop a partnership between Salem Community Church and Wolfsville School.

Salem continues to be the place where the school students will go if a school emergency evacuation is needed.

During the 2024 spring semester, Salem supported the school and its staff with a "Fill-the-Fridge Campaign." Salem kept the fridge in the teachers lounge stocked with soft drinks.

For the 2024 fall semester, Principal Veroni is excited about Salem's Heroes' Club After School Ministry.

Pastor Neil was invited to attend the Wolfsville School Open House and PTA activities to introduce Salem's Heroes' Club to students and parents.

What is Heroes' Club?

Heroes' Club is a Biblically-centered club for students in Kindergarten through 5th grade.

Meeting every Monday afternoon when Frederick County has school, from school dismissal to 5:30 p.m., we will look at trust, courage, forgiveness, obedience and love through the eyes of our Biblical heroes.

Students will move between snack time, play time, a Bible story and activity, and homework time.

Growing closer to one another and closer to God, students will gain greater self-confidence and grow in their faith, looking upon themselves as the Heroes they are!

How does my child get to Heroes' Club

Leaders from Heroes' Club will meet students on Monday afternoons at dismissal of Wolfsville Elementary School. Students will be signed-in to Heroes' Club and walked to Salem Community Church.

All students will remain on church property until parents or other authorized persons pick them up.

If your child does not go to Wolfsville School, but would like to attend Heroes' Club, drop off at Salem begins at 3:45 p.m.

The study is "Luke" Gut-Level Compassion, by Lisa Harper.


Many of us believe that we aren't good enough to meet other people's expectations.


One of our granddaughters, Tara & husband Asheton Root, with their 3 little girls, are in missionary training.

The book details some lesser known facets of Salem's past and the people involved, along with additional pictures.


